

How to sort and dispose of garbage in Kameoka City

Basic rules

- 1 Put it out at the designated place by **8:30 AM on the day of collection.**
- 2 Follow the established sorting methods.
- 3 Keep the garbage station clean to avoid disturbing your neighbors.

* Garbage will not be collected if it has not been put out according to the rules.

Items that can be disposed of by the city

Garbage that must be burned	Food waste, textiles, leather, other
Garbage that must be landfilled	Ceramics, glass, rubber products, metals (except small metals), other

Oversized garbage	Furniture, home appliances, sports and leisure equipment, etc.
Items to be brought in by oneself	High-volume garbage, bricks, concrete blocks, tiles, dead animals ➔ For more information, contact the City Resource Recycling Promotion Section (☎55-5305).

Items that cannot be disposed of by the city

Difficult-to-dispose-of items	Agricultural equipment, construction waste, chemicals, waste oil, paint, fireproof safes, pianos, oil heaters, dead animals over 50 cm, etc.
Industrial waste	Metals and plastics, etc., generated from business sites

* **Soil and stones** are not garbage and cannot be collected by the city.

Garbage that must be burned

Twice weekly/station collection

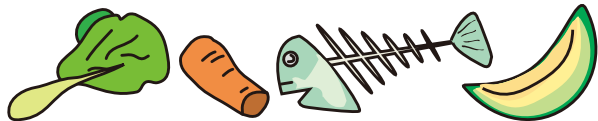
- Use designated garbage bags (bags for garbage that must be burned). Put out no more than about two bags at a time.
- Tie the garbage bag tightly to avoid spills, and do not put in any long objects that may stick out of the bag.

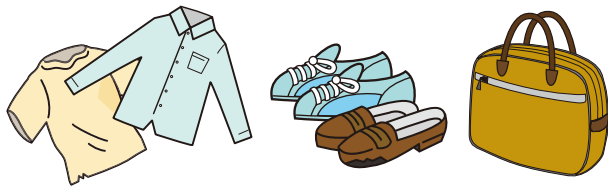
Food waste

Leftovers, vegetable scraps, fruit peels, etc.



Textiles and leathers

Clothes, bags, leather shoes, sneakers, hats, stuffed animals, etc.



Other

Dirty paper, plastic, disposable diapers, etc.

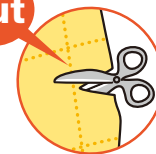


* Objects with unremovable stains.

Key points

- Cut curtains and carpets, etc., to 50 cm or less in length and width.
- Cut ropes, cords, etc., to 3 m or less.

Cut



Garbage that must be landfilled

Twice monthly/station collection

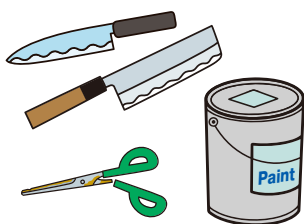
- Use designated garbage bags (bags for garbage that must be landfilled). Put out no more than about two bags at a time.
- Tie the garbage bag tightly to avoid spills, and do not put in any long objects that may stick out of the bag (**excluding umbrellas and fluorescent lights**).



Size	Per bag
30ℓ	30 yen
15ℓ	15 yen

Metals (except small metals)

Blades, scissors, cans other than for food and beverages, etc.



*Only empty cans.

Key points

- Wrap blades in tape and mark the designated garbage bag with a "!".



Ceramics and glass

Glass, plates, cups, flower pots, mirrors, bottles of cosmetics and chemicals, light bulbs, etc.



Rubber products

Boots, hoses, rubber sandals, rubber balls, etc.



Key points

- Cut hoses, ropes, etc., to 150 cm or less.



Other

Used small appliances, etc.



Key points

- Sort items that are too large to fit in the designated garbage bag as oversized garbage.



Recyclable garbage



Plastic Once weekly/station collection

Applicable items

Items made of plastic

- Please put garbage out in a clear bag about 10-45 liters in size with the contents visible.
- * There are no designated garbage bags.
- This excludes plastic bottles and home appliances.



Bottles

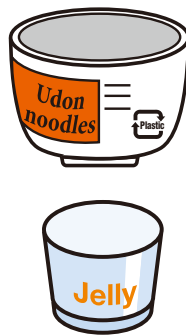
Bottles of shampoo, cooking oil, detergent (laundry and kitchen), dressing, etc.



* Excludes plastic bottles.

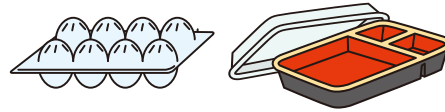
Cups

Cups of instant foods, jellies, etc.



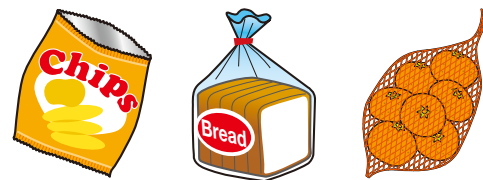
Cartons

Cartons such as egg cartons, convenience store lunches and boil-in-the-bag food pouches



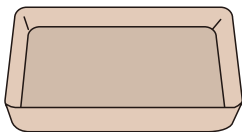
Bags and plastic wrap

Confectionery bags, plastic wrap for fresh food, fruit nets, plastic bags, etc.



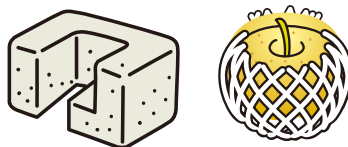
Trays

Trays for meat, fish, and prepared foods



Packaging materials

Styrofoam, air cushion



Other

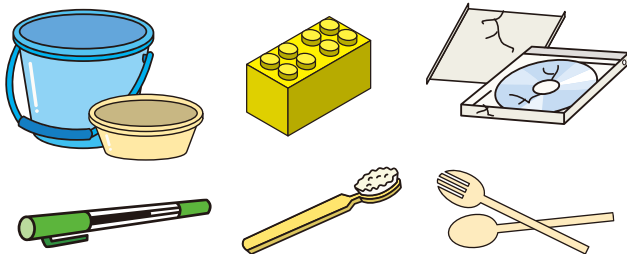
Lids, labels, etc., for plastic bottles, etc.



* Don't put out with food.

Plastic products

Toys, stationery, hangers, plastic buckets, toothbrushes, CDs and DVDs and their cases, etc.



Key points

- The items must be made mostly of plastic.
- The items must be less than 50 cm in length and fit into a 45-liter bag.

Precautions for proper recycling



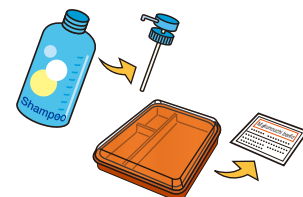
• Empty food scraps, etc.



• Lightly rinse off any dirty items.



• Please do not double bag items.



• Remove caps and labels whenever possible.

Plastic bottles

Twice monthly/station collection



PET

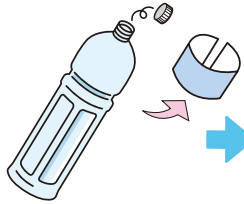
Applicable items

Plastic bottles with the mark shown on the left on them and for food and beverages such as juices, liquor and seasonings

○ Please put garbage out in a bag with the contents visible.

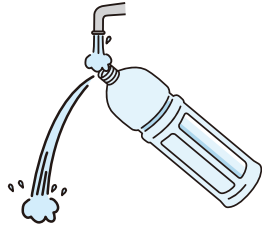
* There are no designated garbage bags.

Key points



• Remove caps (lids) and labels.

* Sort caps and labels as plastic.



• Rinse the inside lightly.



• Crush as best as possible.



• Please put garbage out in a bag with the contents visible.

Lighters

Twice monthly/station collection

Applicable items

Lighters

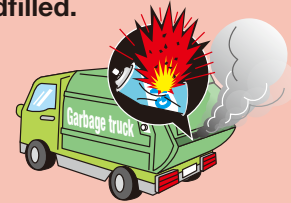


○ Please put items in a bag with the contents visible.

○ Use up the contents before putting out items.



Spray cans and rechargeable batteries can ignite easily, making them very dangerous, so never sort them as garbage that must be landfilled.



Dry and rechargeable batteries

Twice monthly/station collection

Applicable items

Manganese, alkaline, rechargeable and lithium coin batteries (type symbols CR and BR)



* **Lithium coin batteries will be collected.**

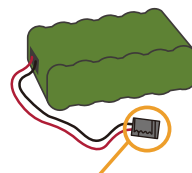


* **Button cell batteries will not be collected.**

○ Please put items in a bag with the contents visible.

○ Button cell batteries (Type symbols SR, LR and PR) are collected at electronics, watch and camera stores.

○ Insulate rechargeable batteries before putting them out.



Cover connectors with plastic tape.

Empty cans (for food and beverages) and spray cans Twice monthly/station collection

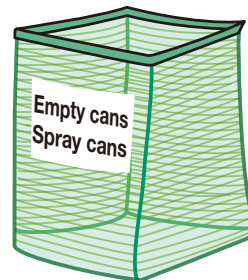
Applicable items

Cans originally containing food or a beverage will be collected.



Sort empty cans other than those for food and beverages as "garbage that must be landfilled."

- Rinse cans lightly without leaving any contents inside.
- Do not strongly crush them.
- Use up as much of the contents of spray cans as possible before putting them out (there is no need to poke holes in them with nails, etc.).
- Remove plastic lids from spray cans and sort them as plastic.



Collection net for empty cans and spray cans

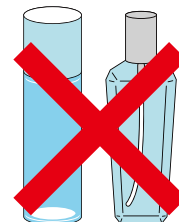
Empty glass bottles (for food and beverages) Twice monthly/station collection

Applicable items

Glass bottles for food and beverages such as juices, beer, liquor and seasonings

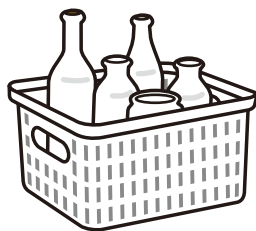


Sort empty glass bottles (cosmetics and chemical bottles, etc.), cups and glassware other than those for food and beverages as "garbage that must be landfilled."



- Sort lids as "garbage that must be landfilled."
- Put colorless bottles in white containers, brown bottles in brown containers, and other colored bottles in black containers.

Empty glass bottles are to be placed in their respective containers by color

That's a crime!

It is prohibited to take recyclable garbage!

Never take recyclable garbage from a garbage station.



Paper Once monthly/station collection

Applicable items

Newspapers, magazines, cardboard, miscellaneous paper, shredded paper

- ⦿ Can be put out even on rainy days.
- ⦿ Use plastic bags (45 liters or less) only for shredded paper.
- ⦿ Use plastic or paper strings.

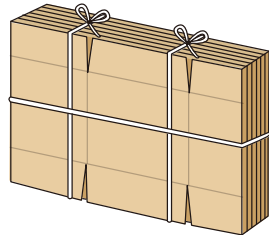

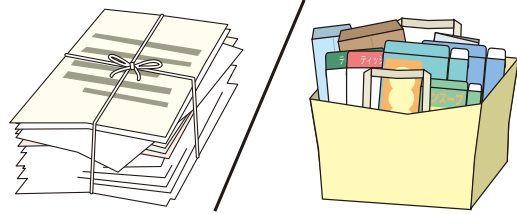

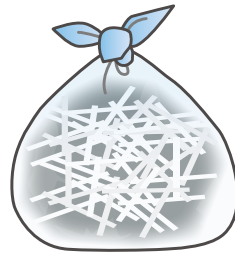

Grass and trees Once monthly/station collection

Applicable items

Cut grass, fallen leaves, pruned branches, raw trees and lumber (No bigger than 50 cm long and 10 cm thick)

Cut grass and fallen leaves

- ⦿ Please put garbage out in a clear bag 45 liters or less in size with the contents visible.

* There are no designated garbage bags.

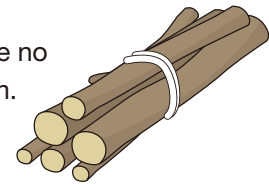


Pruned branches, raw trees and lumber

When bundling

- ⦿ Within 50 cm in length and 10 cm in thickness

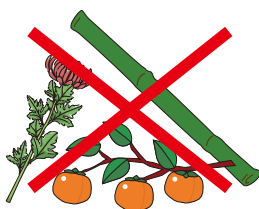
Bundles should be no thicker than 30 cm.



Precautions for proper recycling

- **Separate grass from trees and lumber when putting in a bag.**

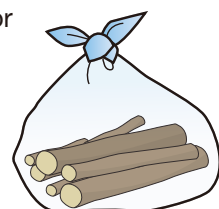
- Sort objects with bamboo, flowers or fruit as **"garbage that must be burned."**



When putting in a bag

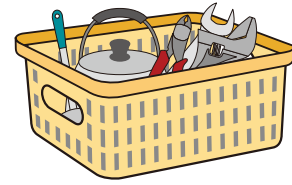
- ⦿ Clear bags of 45 liters or less in size with the contents visible.

* There are no designated garbage bags.



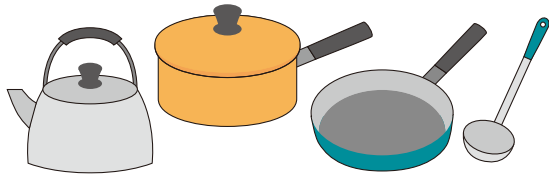
Small metals Twice monthly/station collection

Applicable items Small metals such as kitchenware and household goods (limited to 50 cm or less in length)

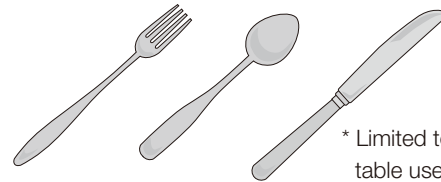


- Put in **orange containers** found at garbage stations.
- Wrap sharp edges with tape, etc., to limit danger.

Kitchenware Pots, kettles, pans, etc.

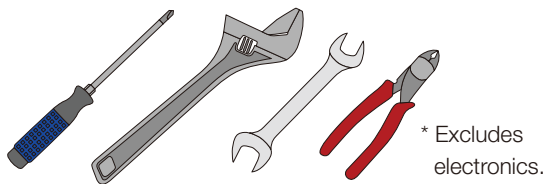


Tableware Spoons, forks, knives, etc.



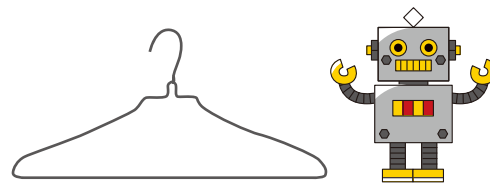
* Limited to knives for table use only.

Tools Screwdrivers, pliers, etc.



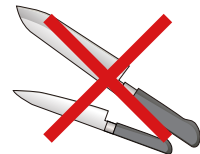
* Excludes electronics.

Other Wire hangers, metal toys, etc.



Key points

- Items made mostly of metal are eligible for collection.
- Knives and utensils (other than for table use) are "garbage that must be landfilled."
- * Other **items over 50 cm in length are not eligible.**



Oversized garbage

**As needed (by application)/
collected at designated location**

Large items that do not fit in designated garbage bags are considered "oversized garbage." There is a fee for each item.



Step 1

Apply for collection

Step 2

Purchase a fee sticker

Purchase a fee sticker for the required amount.

Apply the fee sticker

Step 4

Take to a collection site on the designated day

* Schedules may change during year end/new year holidays. Garbage is also collected on holidays.

*** Please put out your garbage at your garbage collection station by 8:30 AM on the day of collection.**
