From fields of delicate bellflowers in full bloom to the passionate crowds at the football stadium. Kameoka's vibrant spirit flourishes in every scene.




Omoiiro



Experience the beauty of the gorge on a boat ride along the Hozugawa River, while savoring the sights and sounds of nature.


Enjoy the historic Izumo Daijingu Shrine, and indulge in gourmet delights at the serene Yu no Hana Onsen nestled between the mountains.

Kameoka is home to a legacy of remarkable figures who shaped Japan's history. In this edition, we spotlight four influential individuals: Akechi Mitsuhide, Maruyama Okyo, Ishida Baigan, and Suminokura Ryoi. Akechi Mitsuhide constructed the Tamba Kameyama Castle, while Maruyama Okyo revolutionized art with his realistic expression techniques. Ishida Baigan founded the "Sekimon Shingaku" school of thought, and Suminokura Ryoi is renowned for building the Hozugawa River canal. These trailblazers offer a deeper understanding of Kameoka's vibrant culture and heritage.

Explore their historical landmarks and visit the Kameoka City Cultural Museum to uncover more about their contributions.

Akechi Mitsuhide's Landmarks

Akechi Mitsuhide, a vassal of Oda Nobunaga, constructed the Tamba Kameyama Castle. Known for the incident at Honno-ji, where he orchestrated the betrayal of Nobunaga, he is also remembered as a wise ruler who enacted benevolent governance and was greatly admired by the citizens.













Maruyama Okyo's Landmarks

One of the most renowned painters of the Edo period, Maruyama Okyo established a groundbreaking technique of realistic expression. He created numerous stunning fusuma (sliding door) paintings and his unique style continues to influence art to this day.

Ishida Baigan's Landmarks

A philosopher of the Edo period who founded "Sekimon Shingaku". He preached the values of diligence, frugality, honesty, and kindness, principles that still resonate today. A museum dedicated to Ishida Baigan will open in his birthplace in September 2025.

Suminokura Ryoi

A wealthy merchant from the late Sengoku period to the early Edo period in Kyoto. He invested his own wealth to work alongside his son, Soan, in the excavation of the Hozugawa River, opening up the river transport route and laying the foundation for the Hozugawa River boat tours that continue today.

Sanga Stadium by KYOCERA



Opened in 2020 as the home stadium of Kyoto Sanga F.C., this stadium is the only sports-specific venue in Kyoto Prefecture, with a seating capacity of about 21,600. It also features popular e-sports zones and climbing facilities. Surrounding areas have been developed with skate parks, and a city-building initiative

centered around the stadium is underway.



Kameoka's Zero Plastic Waste Declaration

With a goal of achieving zero disposable plastic waste by 2030, Kameoka has enacted Japan's first ordinance banning the provision of plastic shopping bags. The rate of residents bringing their own eco-bags has approached 100%, contributing to the increased environmental awareness within the community. Additionally, the city has implemented a variety of policies aimed at preserving its rich natural environment.

National Urban Greenery Fair in Kyoto-Tamba

The National Urban Greenery Fair in Kyoto-Tamba, held from September 18 to November 8, 2026, is one of Japan's largest green events. With the theme "Shining Kyoto-Tamba through Food, Agriculture, Environment, and Art", the fair showcases the region's charm through park development, exhibitions, workshops, and more. It aims to promote sustainability and contribute to the creation of greener urban spaces.


